AMA Style. AMA was developed by the American Medical Association for the purpose of writing medical research. References are found at the end of a manuscript and are titled "Reference List," and each item should be listed in numerical order (two references should not be combined under a single reference number) as opposed to alphabetically.

Whatever reference style is used (e.g. AMA, NLM), consistency is imperative Each reference is separated into bibliographic groups by a period. Within each group, commas, semi-colons, or colons are used. Authors: Use authors' surname followed by their initials without periods. If there are < 6 authors, all should be named. If there

The Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA style) and the AMA Manual of Style (AMA style) both appear to be silent on the issue of abbreviating the word figure, so you can safely assume that you should spell out—and capitalize—the word figure in all references if you follow either of those guides. 7

The word number may be abbreviated No. in the body of tables and line art or in the text when used as a specific designator. Do not use the number sign (#) in place of the abbreviation.

How to Reference Tables and Figures in Text

The three purposes of references, according to the American Medical Association in the AMA Manual of Style , are to document, acknowledge, and direct readers to additional resources. Periods divide each reference into bibliographic groups.

Excerpt from the AMA Manual of Style: For a table to have maximum effectiveness, the information it contains must be arranged logically and clearly so that the reader can quickly understand the key point and find the specific data of interest. Information in tables should be organized into columns and rows by type and category, thereby simplifying access and display of data and information.
